A COOLER COOLER

Charles Samuel, our St. Francis of Assisi Facilities Manager, contracted with a firm to move the compressor for the walk-in cooler outside. This has many advantages, including allowing it to work more efficiently, removing its exhaust heat outside allowing the freezers and refrigerator to operate more efficiently, providing a cooler workplace in the back rooms, and making the back rooms less noisy. It required running refrigerant lines and electrical power to the west side of the building.



John Tondre removed the things stored above the cooler and near the compressor. Tim Coyle arranged to store the easily perishable food in other refrigerators. The compressor was moved in less than one day, and our walk-in cooler was back in operation. Tim readjusted the thermostat, and all is working fine. The back rooms are noticeably cooler now. Great job by all.

SELFLESS SHELF SERVICE

At times we need additional shelves to store the food and equipment. So an anonymous volunteer took it upon himself to build a shelf



above the walk in cooler door. Thank you to the volunteer for all you do for our Mobile Loaves and Fishes.

AED UPDATE

After a regulatory delay, an AED has been installed in our kitchen. The training is scheduled for September. We can use the AEDs in the event of an emergency even before we have had formal training. The AED gives verbal instructions on how to use it. Once the pads are applied on a person's chest the AED will assess the situation and tell you how to proceed. The AED determines whether or not a person needs to have the shock administered.



BIBLE MINISTRY - CLARIFICATION

The Food Bank receives some food from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. They have a policy that participation in any religious activity, or holding a particular religious belief shall not be required to receive the food. That does **not** mean that we cannot have Bibles available for people who want them. Mark Gavora has adopted a ministry of providing Bibles for this purpose. So our truck should always have a few Bibles available for people who want one.

- * Restock bread in the freezer in the kitchen
- * Restock peanut butter, jelly, and Ziploc bags into cabinet
- * If depleted, bag cookies, chips, condiments, etc.
- * Sweep and mop the floor
- * Put trash and recyclables into corresponding dumpsters

Things to do When you are Through

- * Move oldest boiled eggs from secondary to primary refrigerator
- * Check and record refrigerator and freezer temperatures
- * Wash, dry, and fold towels and wash rags
- * Sort clothes
