had the entire 600 pounds sliced. That amounted to about 17,500 slices of cheese! That is enough for about two months of turkey and cheese sandwiches! 'You cheddar believe it!'

suffering on the streets, then you believe in the power of relation, not transaction. You believe in friendship, not funds. You believe in love as ultimate shelter.

# Things to do BEFORE you are Through

- \* Sweep and mop the kitchen floor
- \* Clean the tables and counters
- \* Fill out the cleaning log
- \* Fill out the MLF Truck Run Log or on-line report after deliveries <u>and</u> use the bottom section to report any unusual events or problems that occur. The QR code for the reporting website is posted on the bulletin board. This applies whether you use the truck for delivery or not.
- \* Restock bread in the freezer in the kitchen
- \* Restock peanut butter, jelly, and Ziploc bags into cabinet
- \* Put trash and recyclables into corresponding dumpsters

## Things to do When you are Through

- \* Move oldest boiled eggs from secondary to primary refrigerator
- \* Check and record refrigerator and freezer temperatures
- \* Bag cookies, chips, condiments, etc.
- \* Wash, dry, and fold towels and wash rags
- \* Restock gloves in cabinet
- \* Sort clothes
